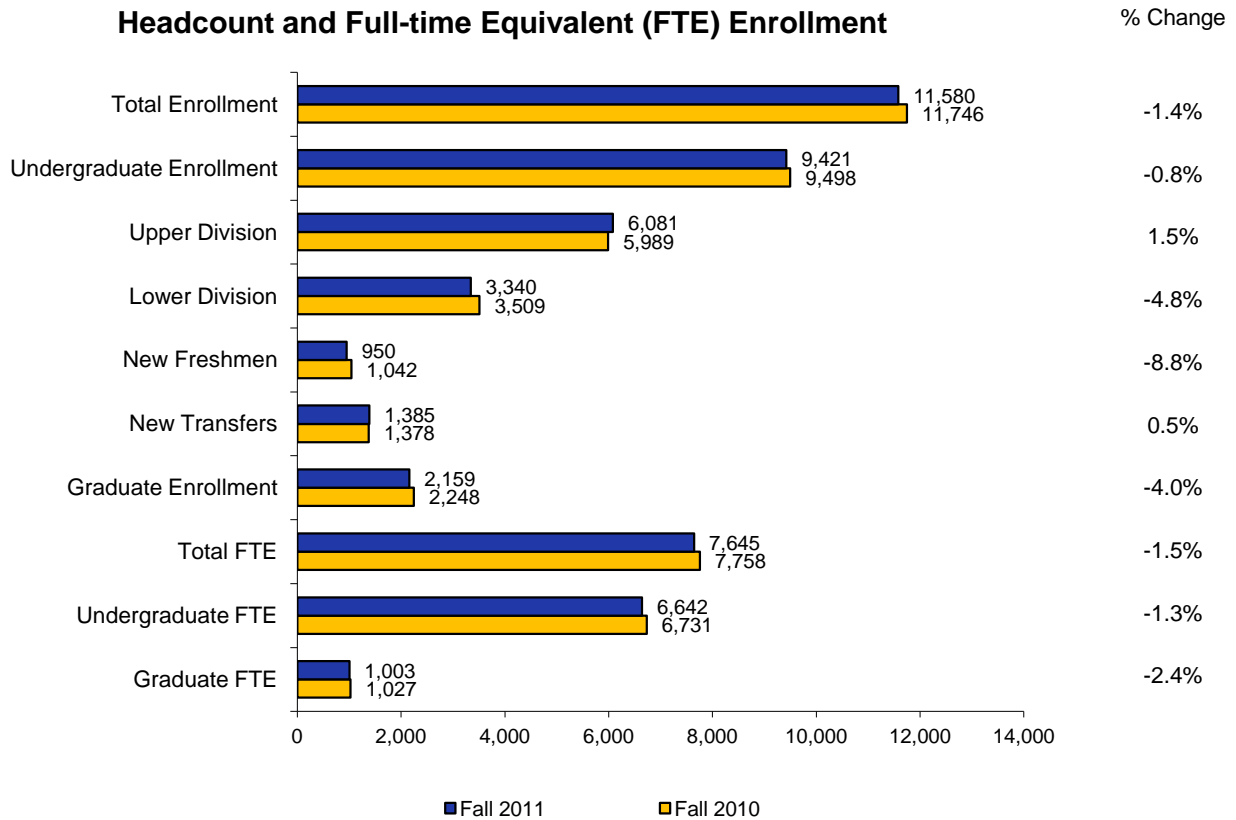

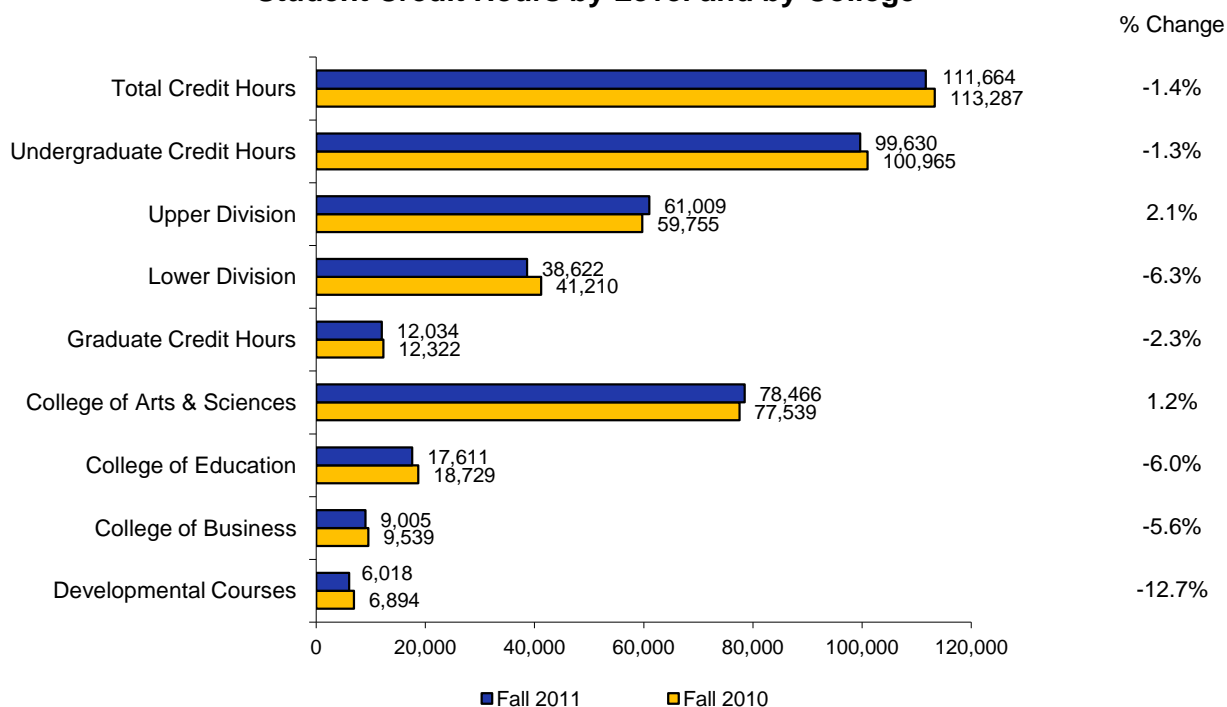

- ❖ Total headcount enrollment in Fall 2011 is 11,580 students, decreases 1.4 percent from the previous fall term. Total FTE enrollment decreases by 1.5 percent.
- ❖ Undergraduate enrollment totals 9,421 students, down 77 students (0.8 percent), while undergraduate FTE enrollment decreases 1.3 percent from the previous fall term. Enrollment by new first-time freshmen declines from 1,042 in previous fall term to 950 students (8.8 percent). New transfer student enrollment increases by 0.5 percent. Overall, lower division enrollment declines nearly 5 percent, while upper division enrollment experiences a 1.5 percent increase.
- ❖ Graduate enrollment totals 2,159 students, down 4 percent from the previous fall. Graduate FTE enrollment shows a decrease of 2.4 percent.

- ❖ The total number of student credit hours generated in Fall 2011 is 111,664, lowered by 1.4 percent from the previous fall term. Credit hours at both undergraduate and graduate levels are lower, down 1.3 and 2.3 percent, respectively, in comparison to Fall 2010. Changes in the number of student credit hours closely mirror the changes in enrollment headcount, as evidenced in the increase of 2.1 percent in upper division credit hours and the decrease of 6.3 percent in lower division credit hours.
- ❖ College of Arts and Sciences generated 78,466 student credit hours, up 1.2 percent from the previous fall. Academic Development courses experience the largest decrease in student credit hours of 12.7 percent, followed by the 6 percent decrease in Education credit hours and 5.6 percent decrease in Business and Management credit hours.
